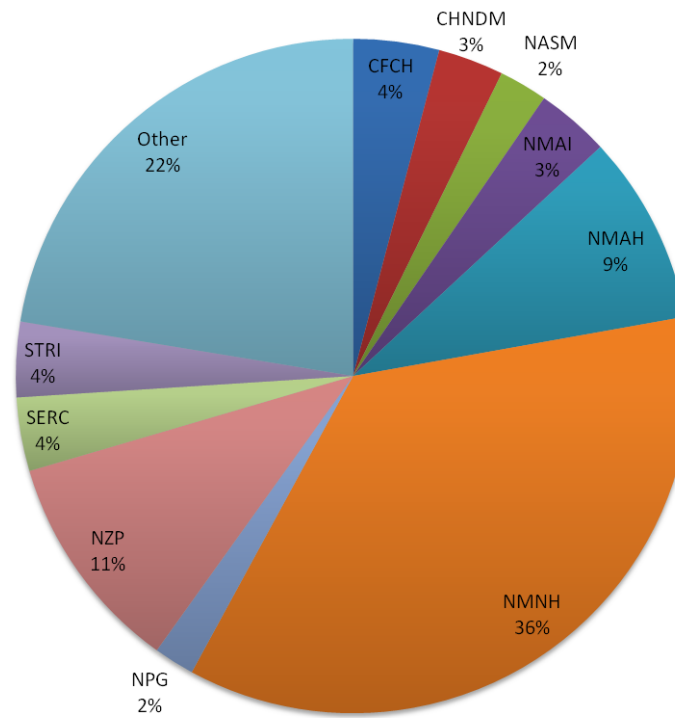

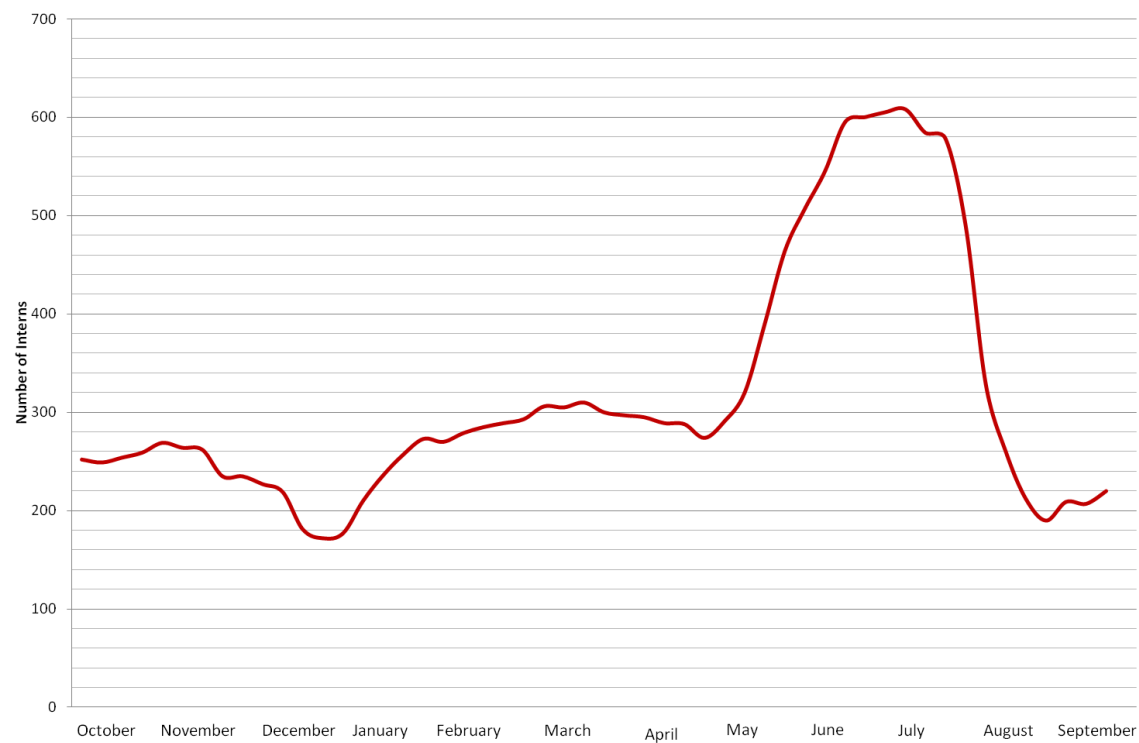

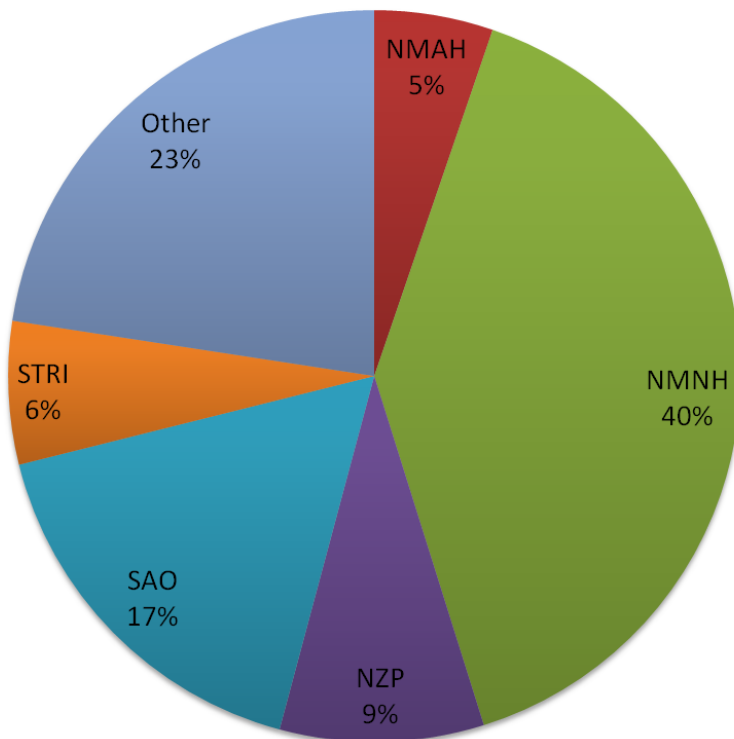

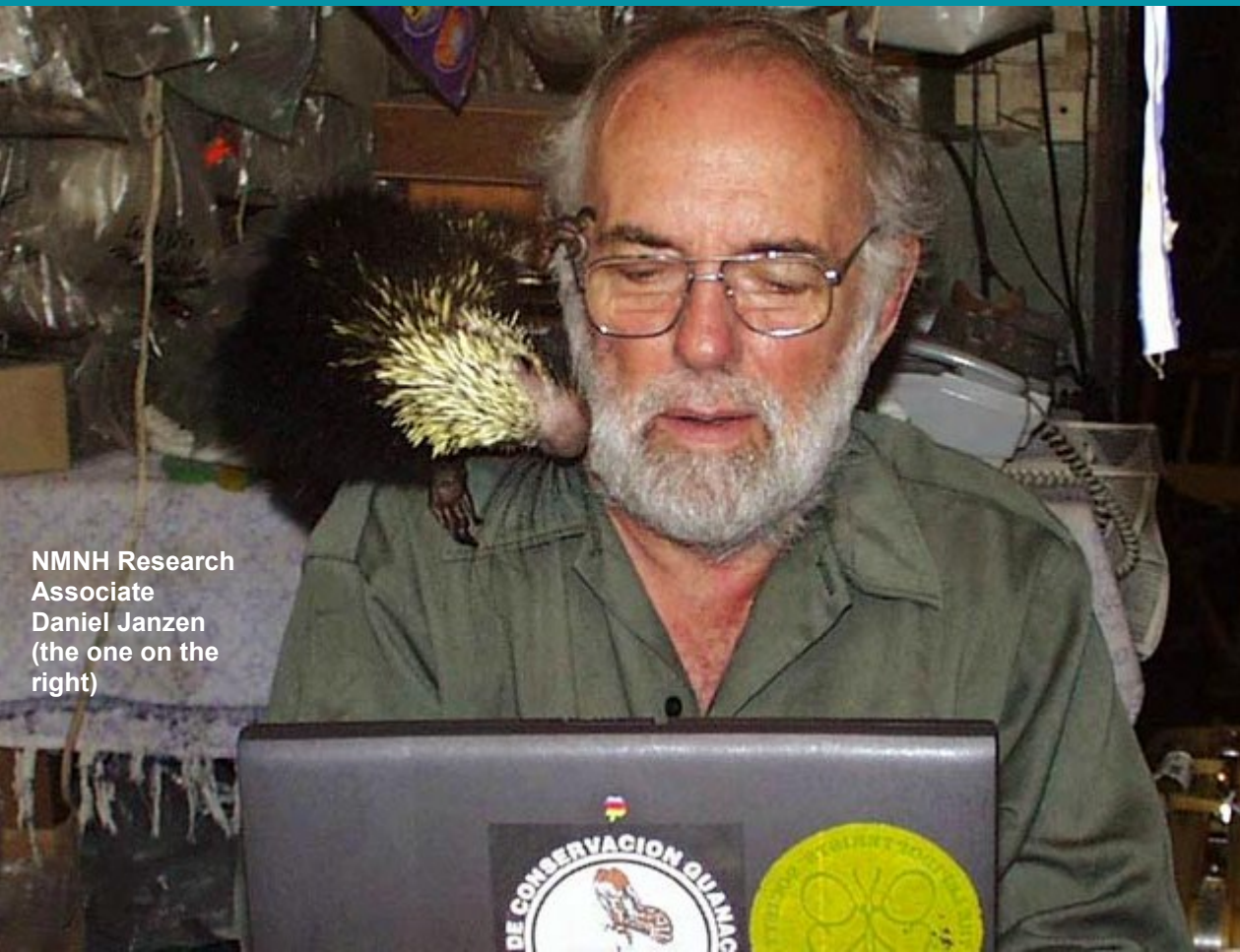

administration staff to better understand how scholarship informs policy matters.

- The program provides opportunities for fellows to meet with leaders of all kinds. They may engage with leaders at government agencies, members of Congress, ambassadors, experts at nonprofit organizations and think-tanks, and others.
- Consideration also may be given to training programs and other social (networking) events offered within and outside the Smithsonian.
- The Smithsonian Office of Fellowships and Internships provides administrative support including an orientation to the Smithsonian.

Is the Fellowship right for you?

Candidates are evaluated on four main criteria:

- The timeliness of the proposed research project.
- How closely their career aspirations relate to the opportunity.
- Potential for leadership as evidenced by past performance.
- The quality of their academic record.

Candidates must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents, and not more than five years beyond receipt of their Ph.D. degree by December 31. Candidates with professional degrees are also eligible to apply.

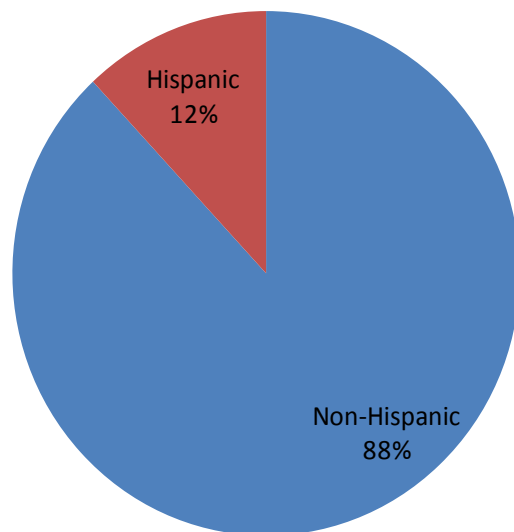

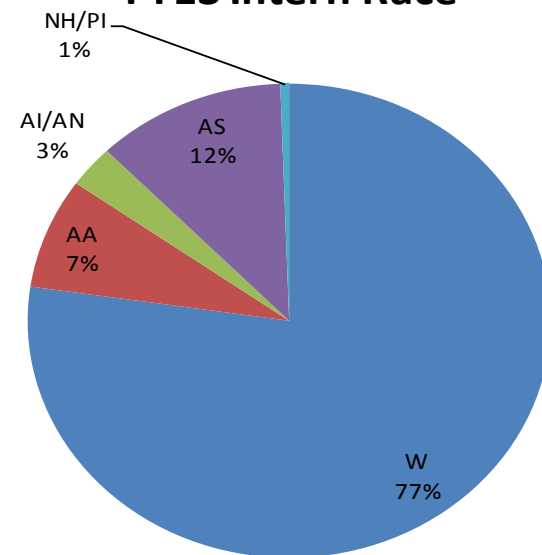

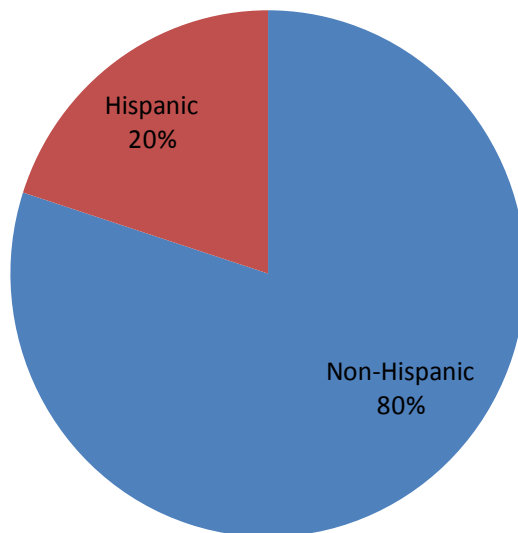
FY13 Intern Ethnicity



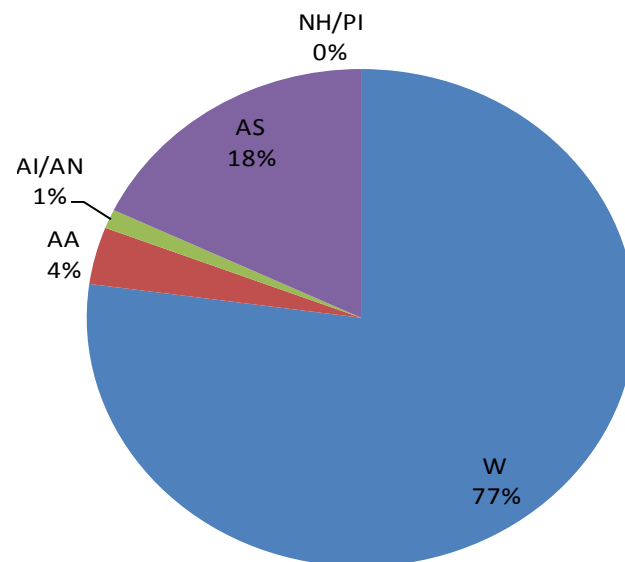
FY13 Intern Race

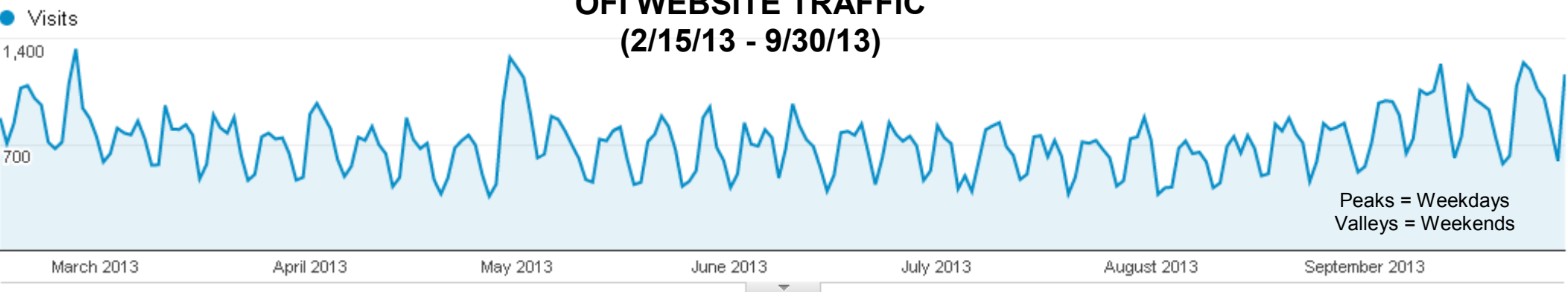

In FY14 OFI will continue to strengthen, diversify and develop academic appointment opportunities at the Smithsonian by pursuing the following initiatives:

Strengthen

- OFI will focus on improving the quality of the [Smithsonian Institution Fellowship Program](#) application and review process for both applicants and reviewers
- FY14 will bring the introduction of SOFIAA, an electronic counterpart to SOLAA
- OFI will increase efforts to accurately set expectations surrounding academic stipends
- OFI will work with OIR to streamline academic appointee visa processes
- OFI will refine tools for capturing metrics related to academic appointees at the Smithsonian
- OFI will launch a Ted-style speaker series featuring SI Fellows
- OFI will do more with video
- OFI will ensure that compliance with all SI legal and financial obligations related to academic appointees is documented
- OFI will host regular training for would-be mentors/advisors

- OFI will publicize the [Smithsonian Institution](#) and [James Smithson](#) Fellowship programs to targeted universities and departments.
- OFI will work with OEEMA and OHR to publicize SI employment opportunities to SI Intern and Fellow alumni.
- OFI will help coordinate and support robust SI presence at FY14 conferences that align with each of the four White House Minority Serving Institution initiatives.
- OFI will promote the placement of local interns to unfilled learning opportunities in the fall and spring

- OFI will establish regular contact with and re-engage SI Fellow/Intern alumni
- OFI will pursue partnerships with outside organizations that align with the SI mission and are resource positive
- OFI will work with OA to highlight academic appointments as an avenue for framing endowments and gifts

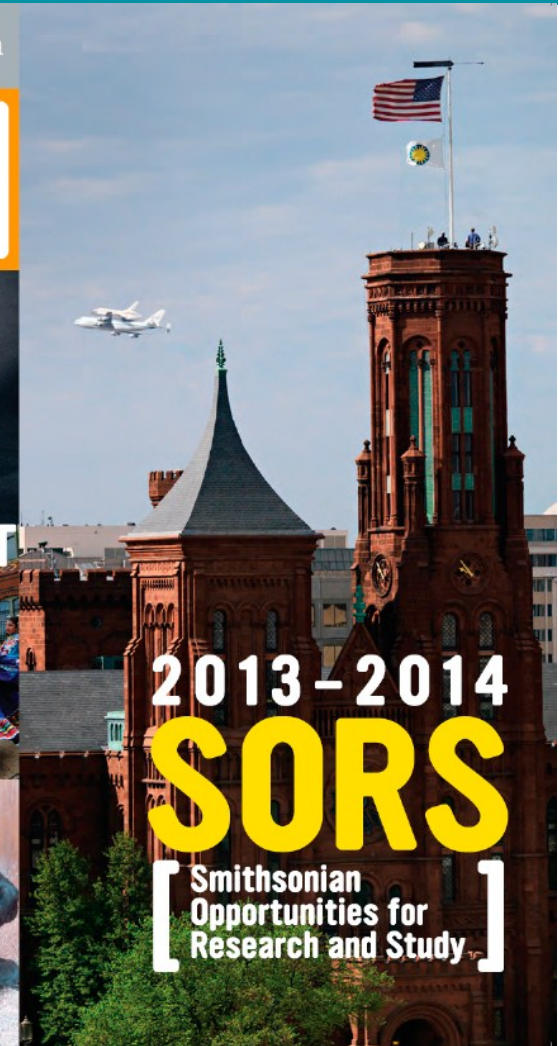
